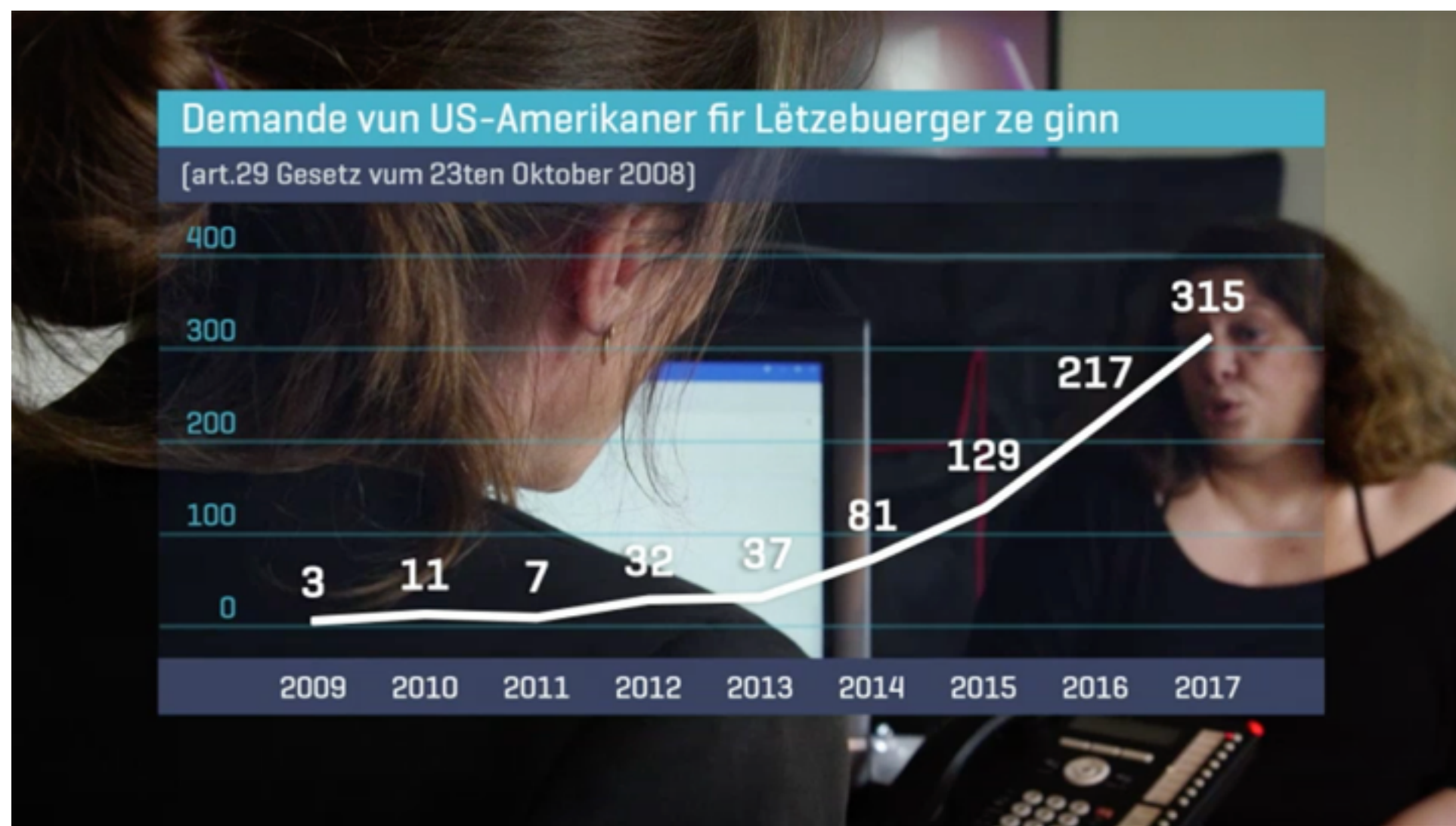

Embracing A .2% Population Change

The Luxembourg Nationality Act of October 23rd, 2008 which came into force on January 1st, 2009, introduced the principle of dual (or multiple) nationality in Luxembourg.

This new law offered a path to recovery of Luxembourg nationality for certain individuals with an ancestor from the country. On December 31, 2018, this eligibility will come to an end.



By 2017, over 800 United States citizens had recovered Luxembourg nationality through their ancestry.

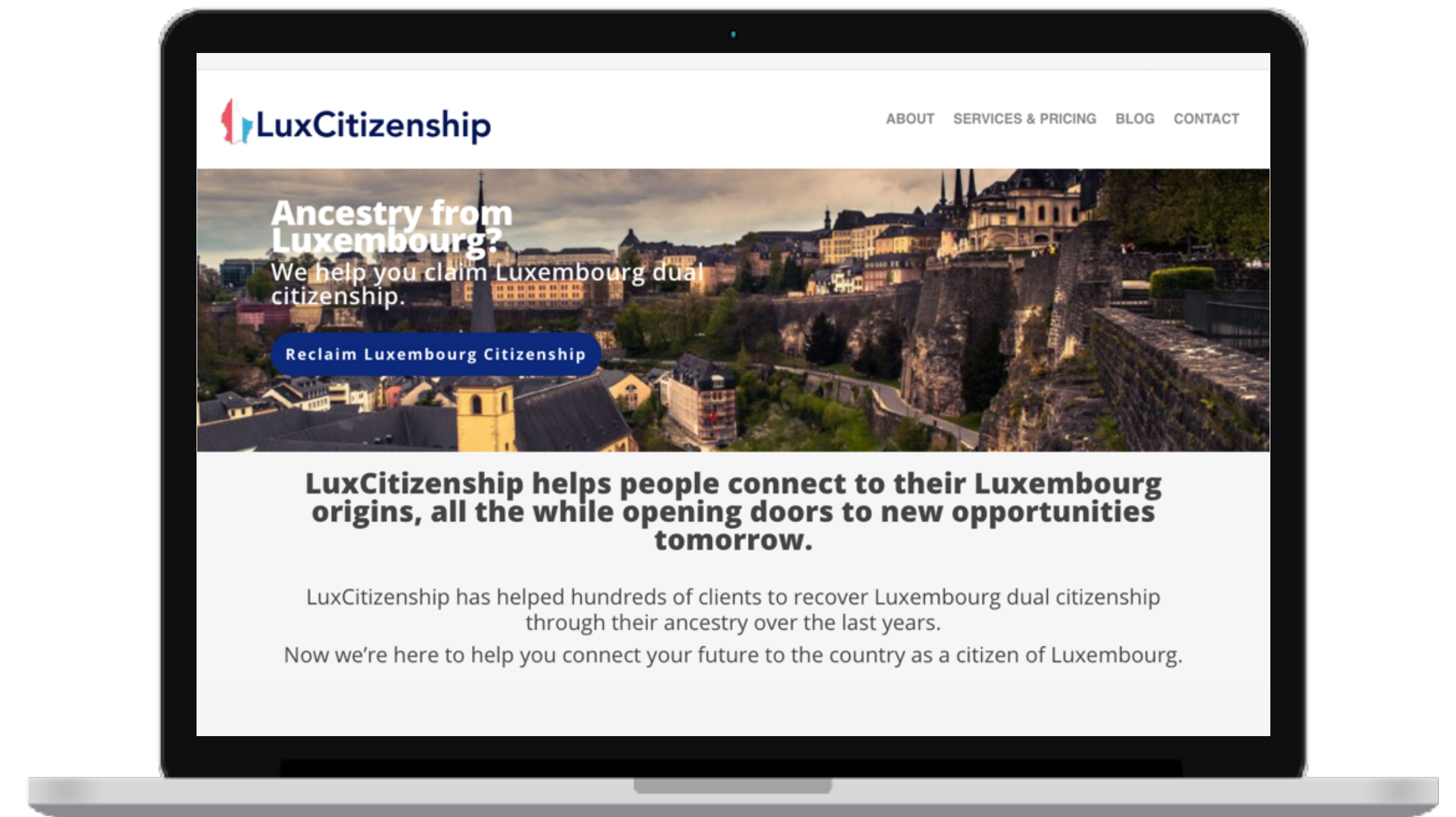
Most importantly, this figure only represents the number of applicants who have fully completed this lengthy, two-stage process. It does not count those who have started, but have not fully completed, the recovery process.

According to the 1940 US census, over 100,000 “Luxembourgish-Americans” lived in the United States. By that figure, as many as 2,950,000 Americans might qualify for Luxembourg nationality recovery today.

There is reason to believe a large number of applications to recover Luxembourg nationality were started in 2018 (the final year).

LuxCitizenship launched in February 2018 and only operating on a part-time basis has helped 241 individuals apply for a Luxembourg Ancestor Certificate.



800 new Luxembourgers would already be equivalent to a **0.2%** net population change for the number of individuals of Luxembourg nationality living in Luxembourg (313,705)*.

As the total number of eventual new Luxembourgers will be larger than a 0.2% net population change, it's time to start understanding who are these new Luxembourgers. In any case, they'll be invading Luxembourg in droves over the next 28 months.

The following is a unique in its kind study giving a profile of who are these American-Luxembourgers.

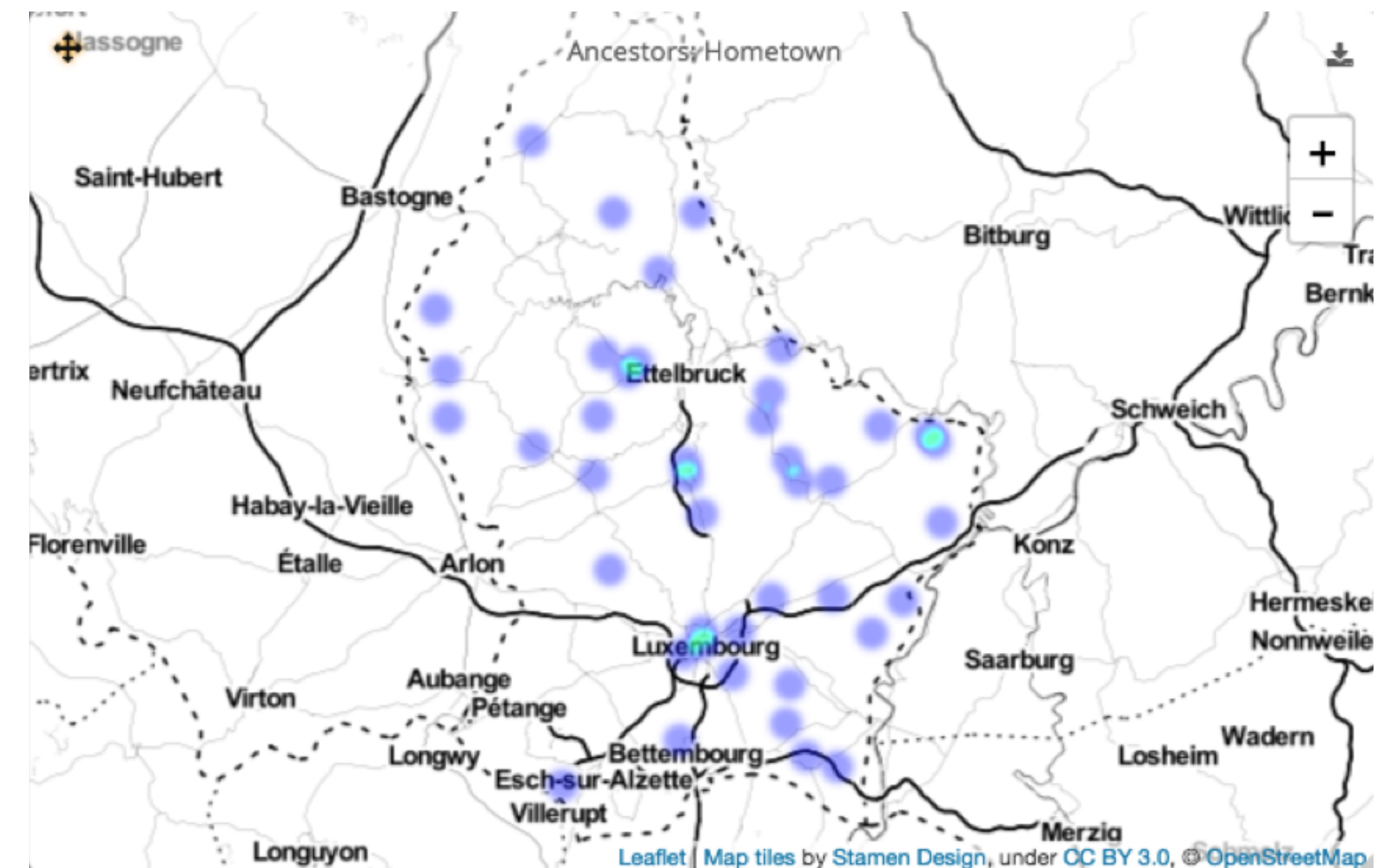


Who Were the Ancestors from Luxembourg?

Qualifying ancestors for the recovery of Luxembourg nationality were individuals either residing or born on the territory of Luxembourg (as defined by the Treaty of Vienna) who were living on or after Jan 1, 1900.

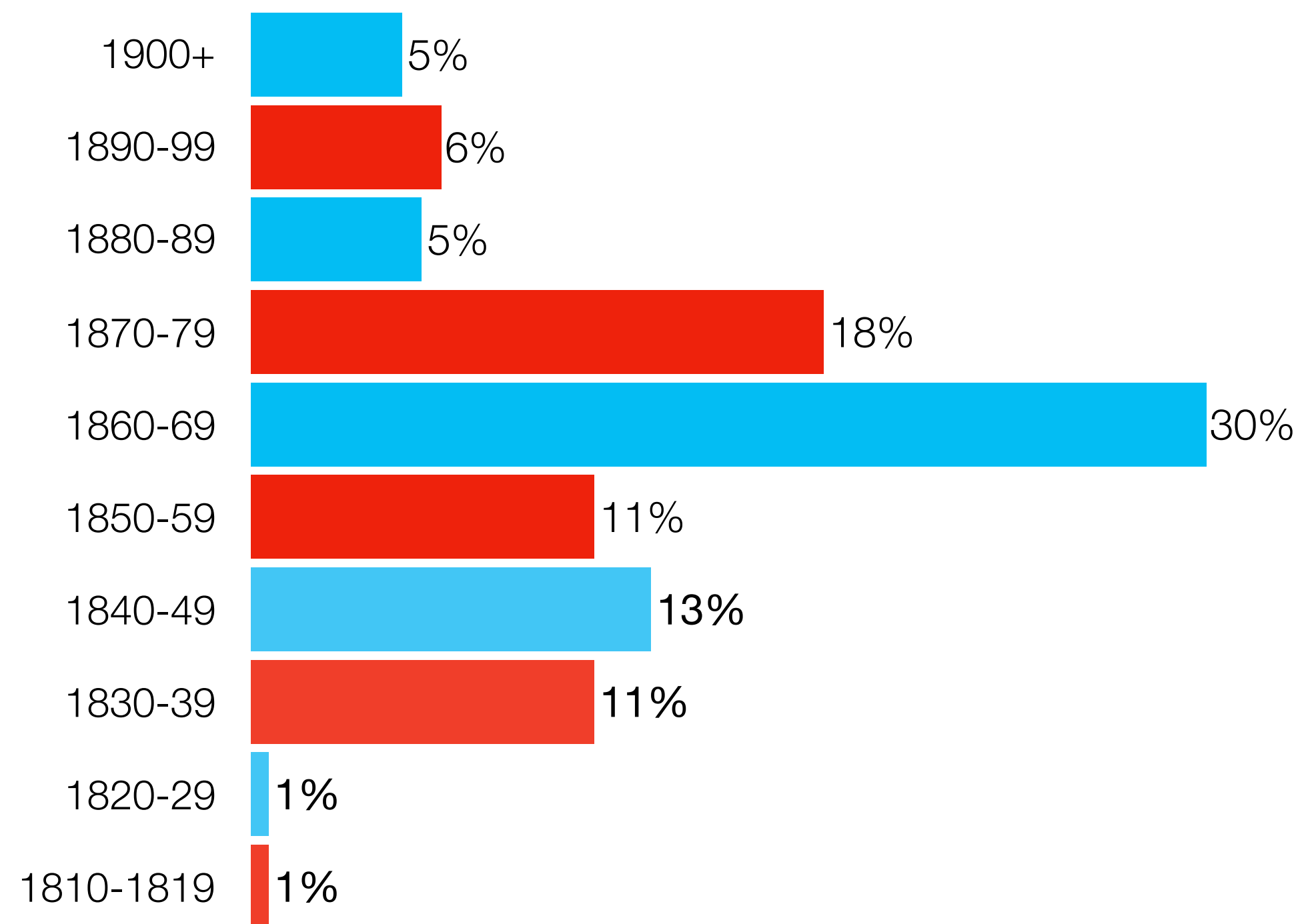
For our **241-person** study group, there were **46** Luxembourg ancestors.



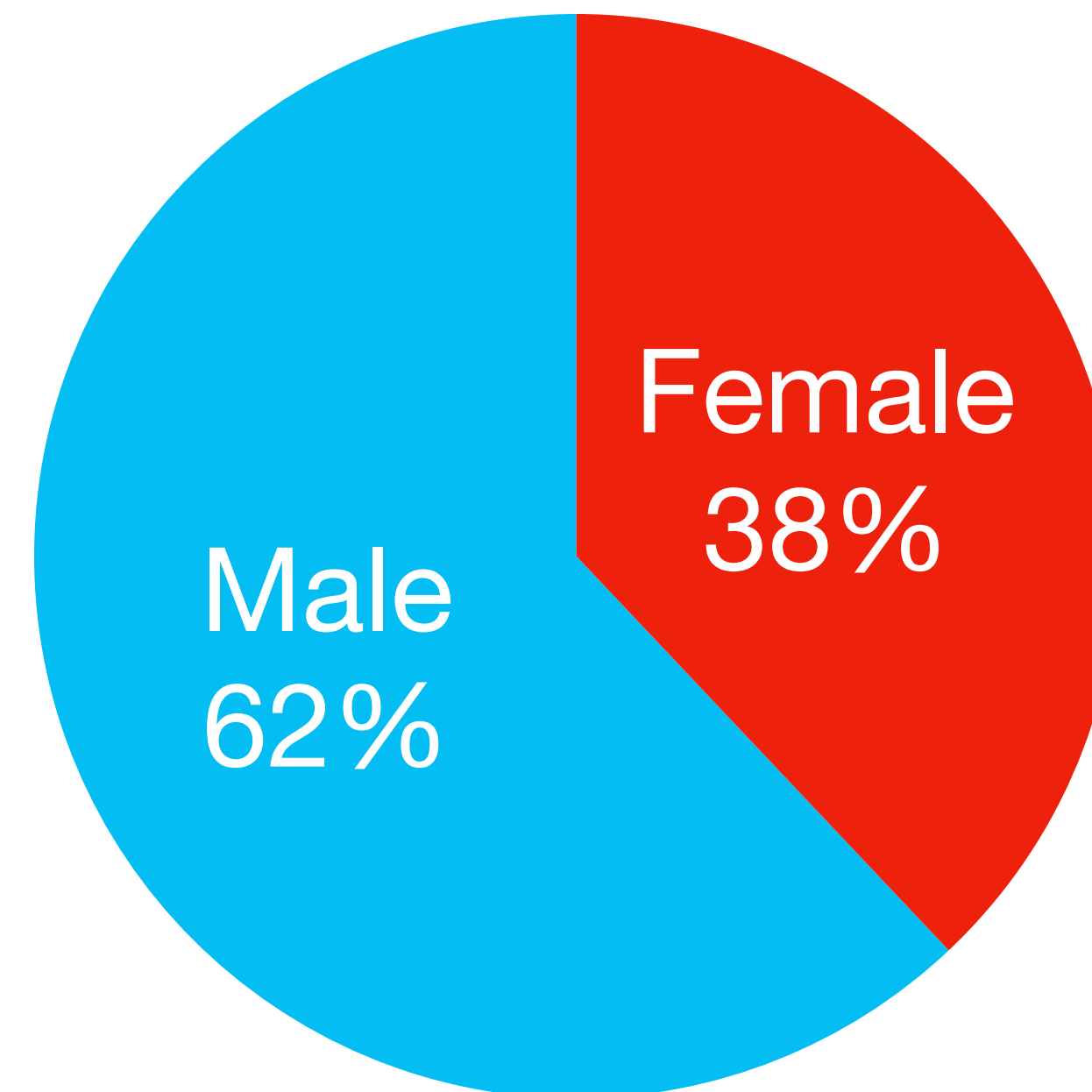
Map of Ancestor Communes of Origin in Luxembourg

Luxembourg Ancestors' Birth Year

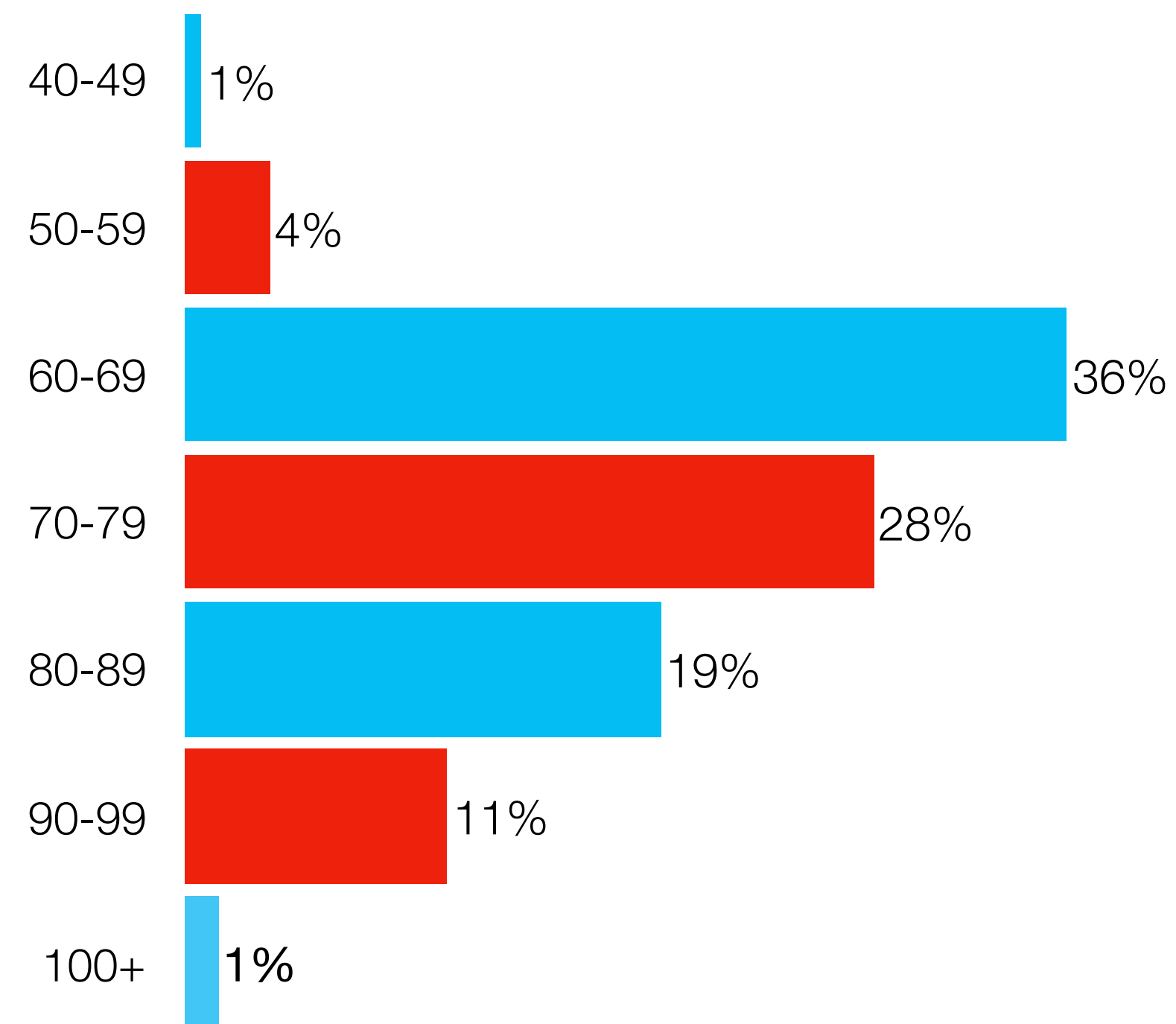


Luxembourg Ancestors' Gender

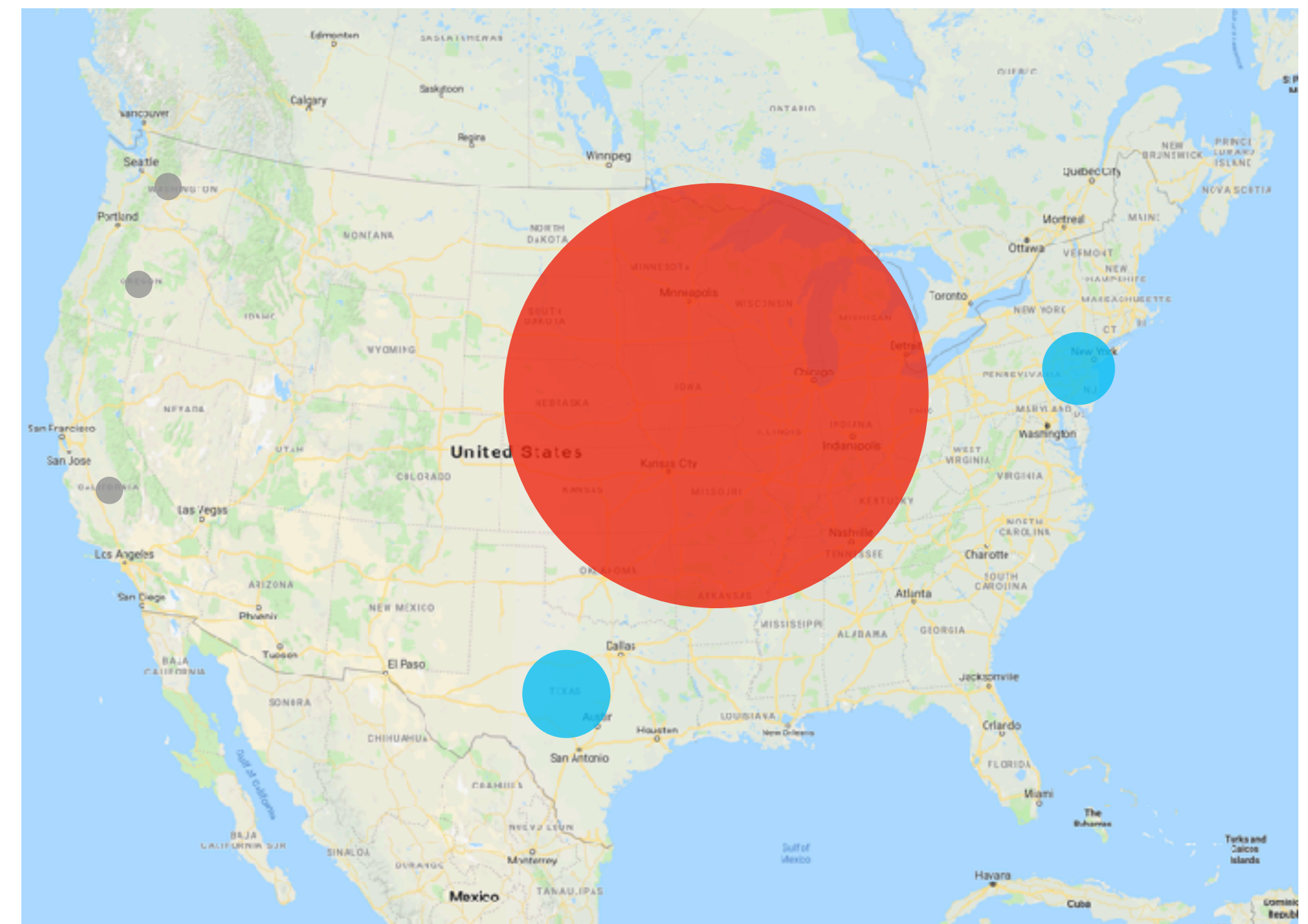


Who Were the Ancestors from Luxembourg?

Age of Luxembourg Ancestor When Deceased

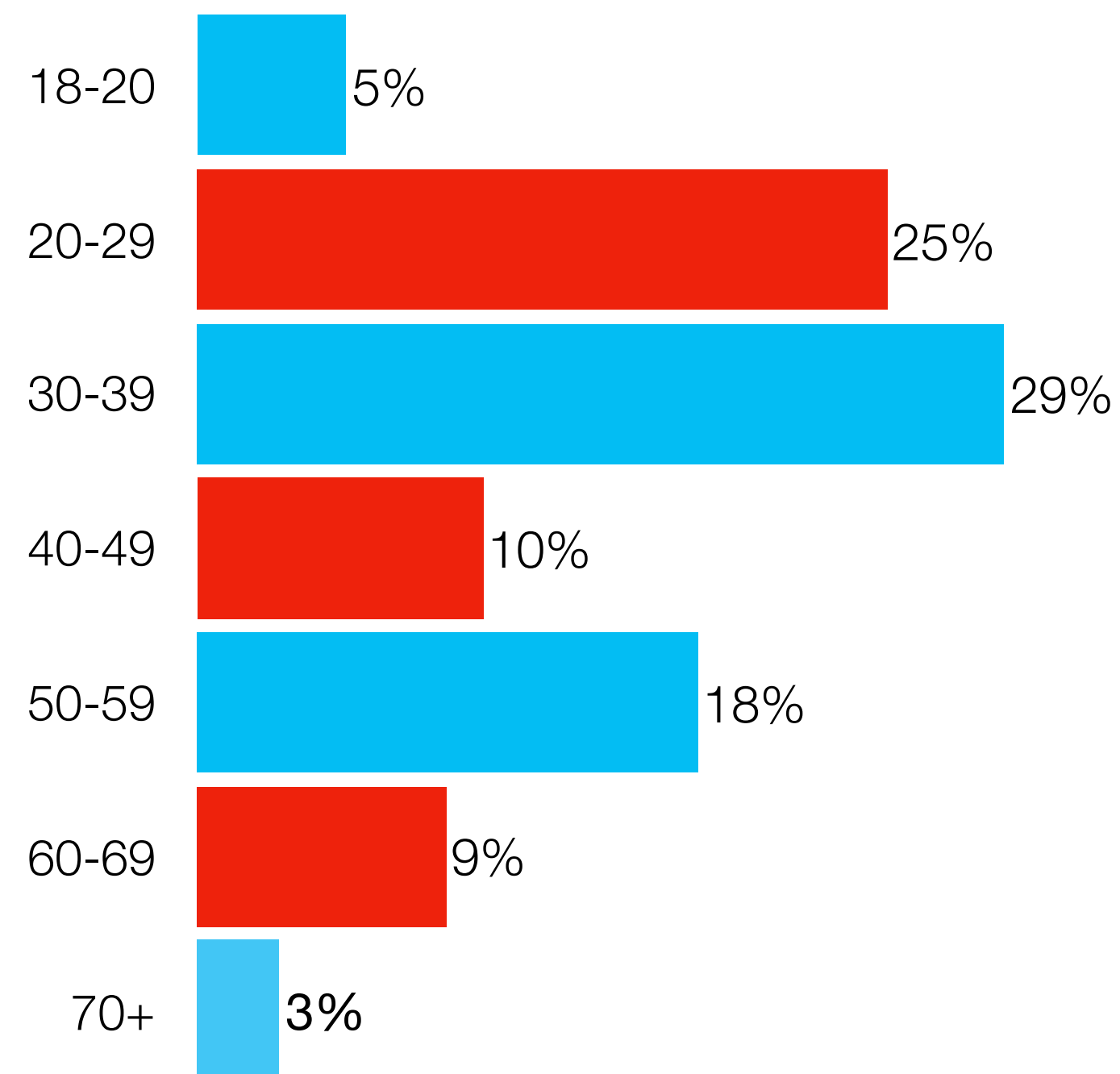


Where the Luxembourg Ancestor Passed Away

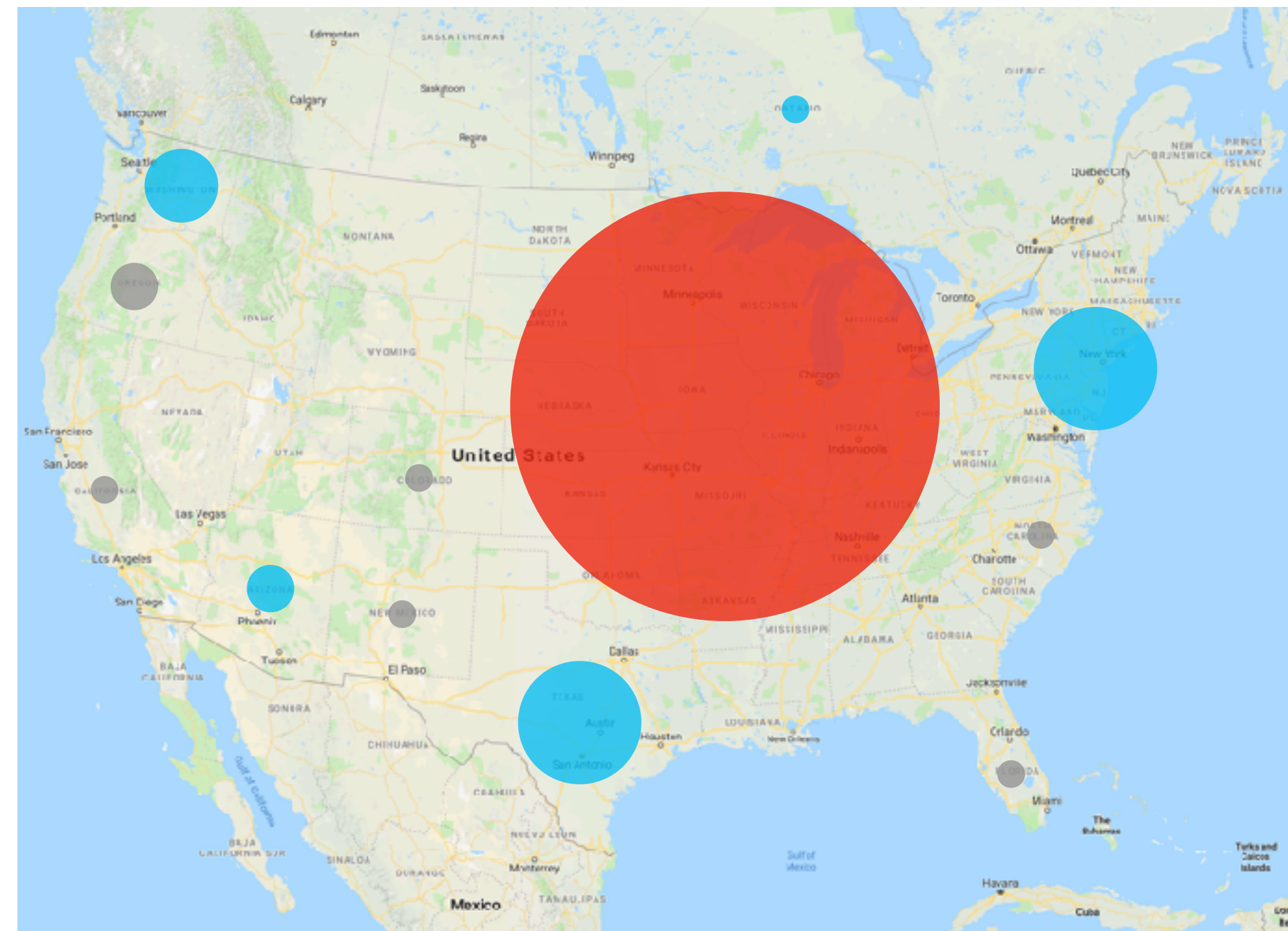

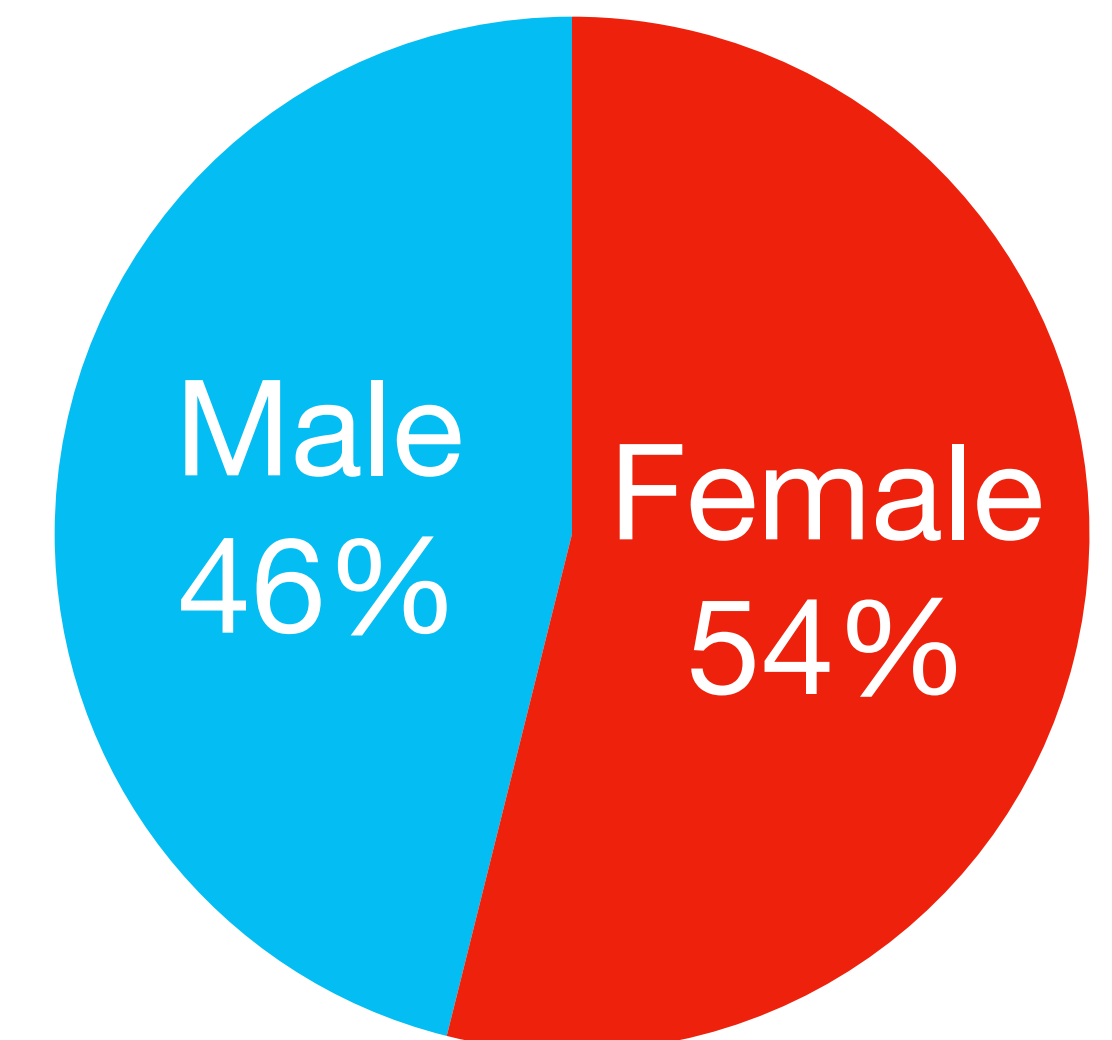
Client Current Age



Client Birth Locations



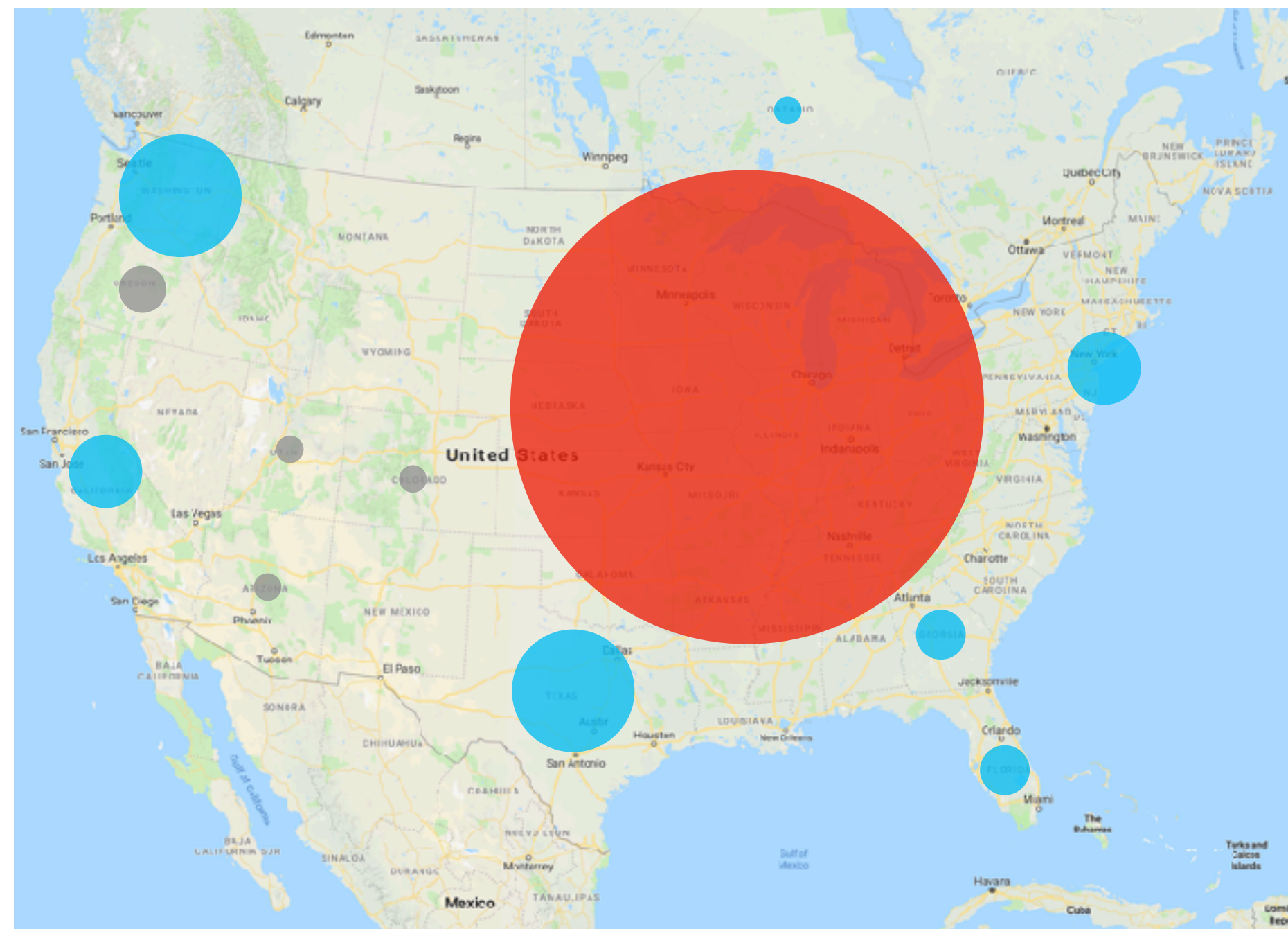
Client Gender



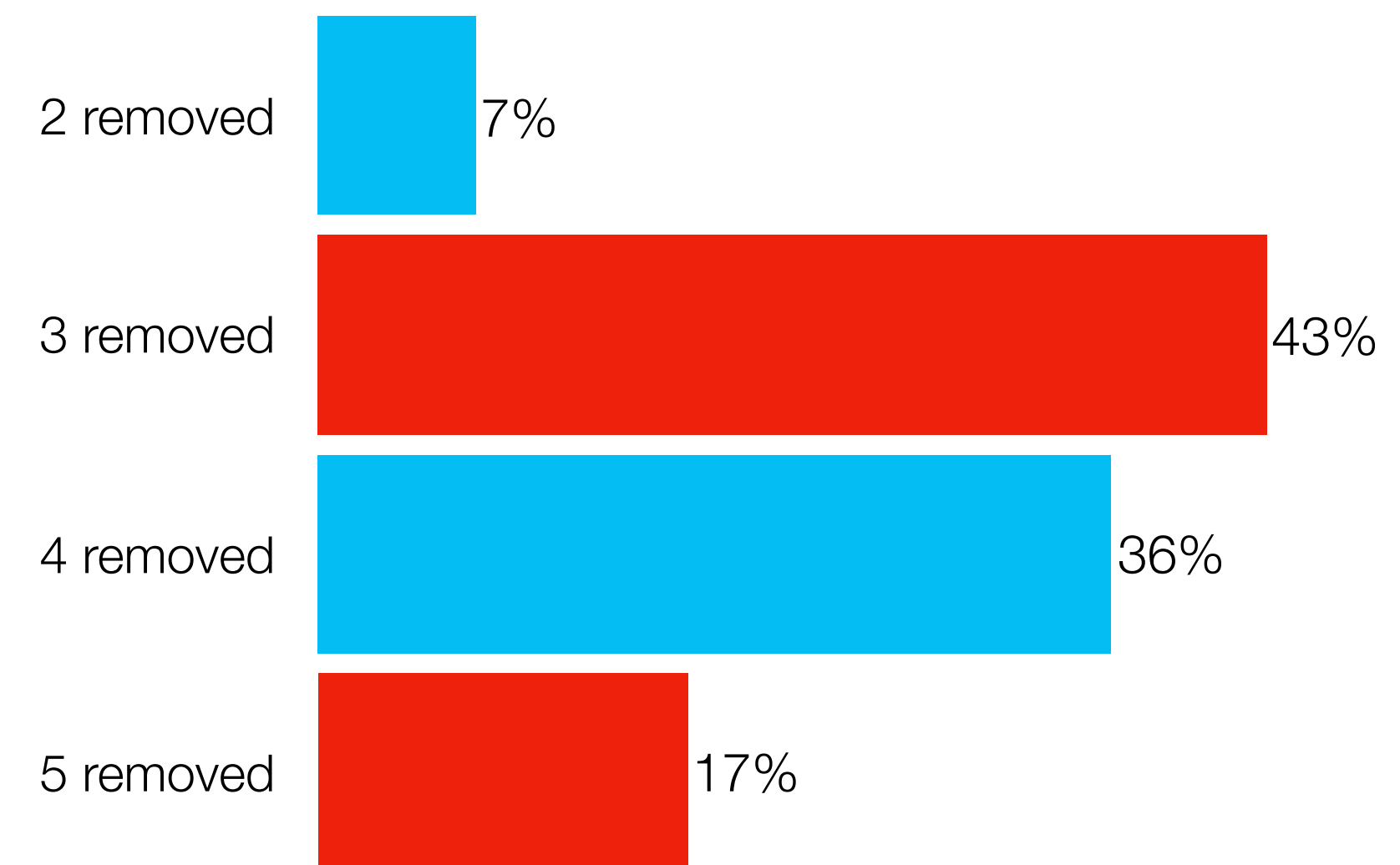

Where do clients live today?

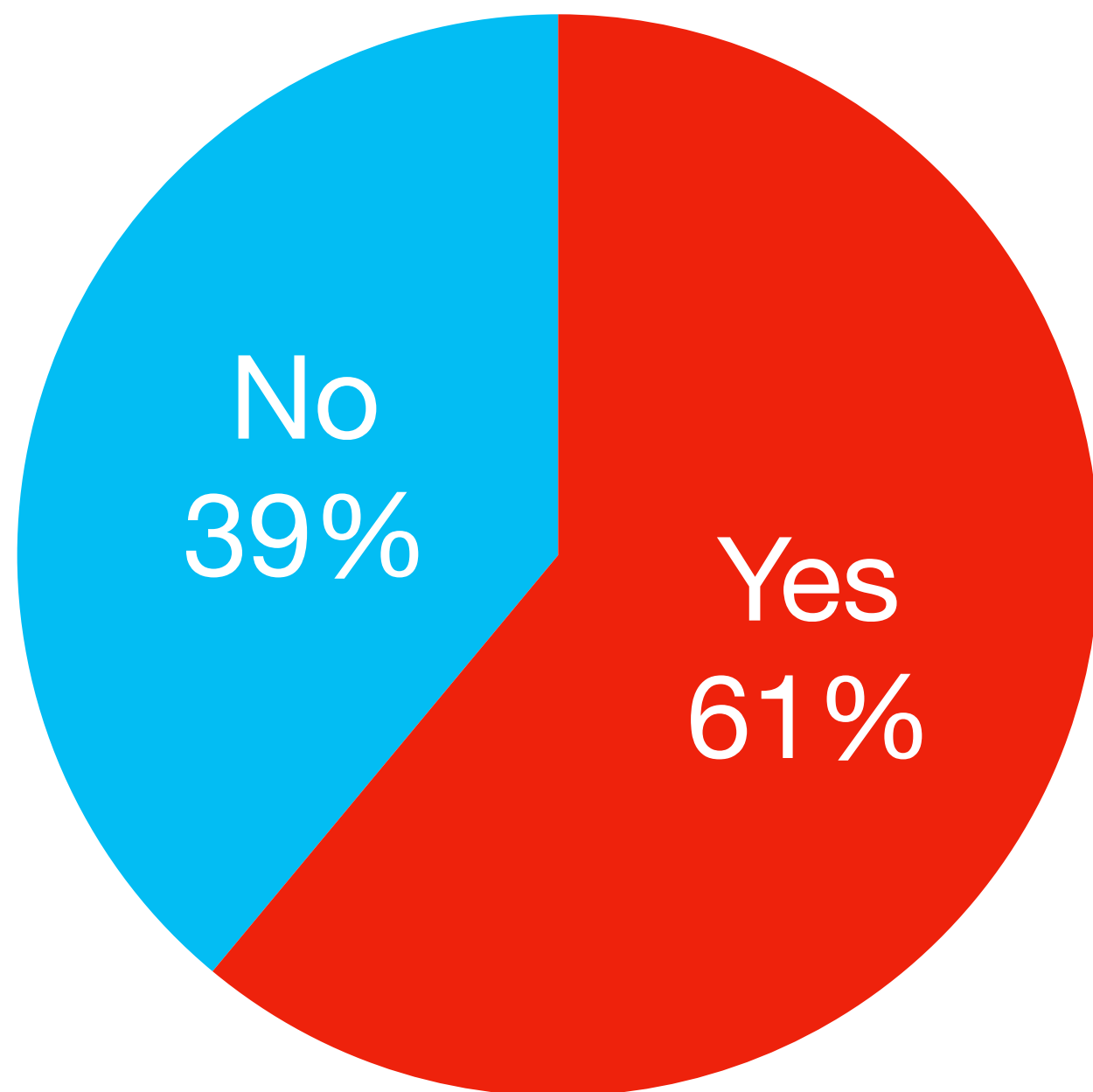


Number of generations removed from the Luxembourg ancestor

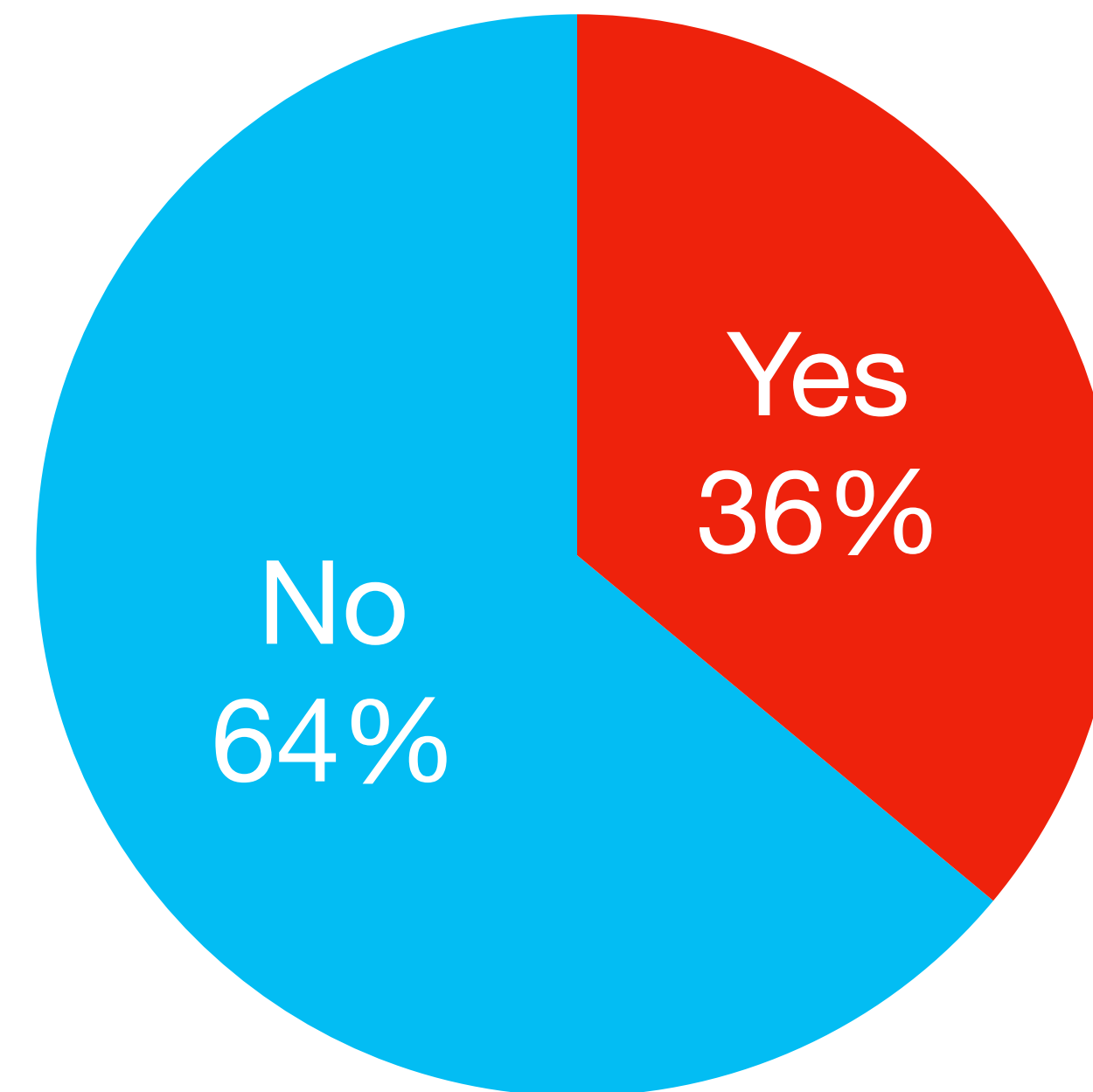


Who are the American-Luxembourgers?

Born in Same State As Ancestor's Death



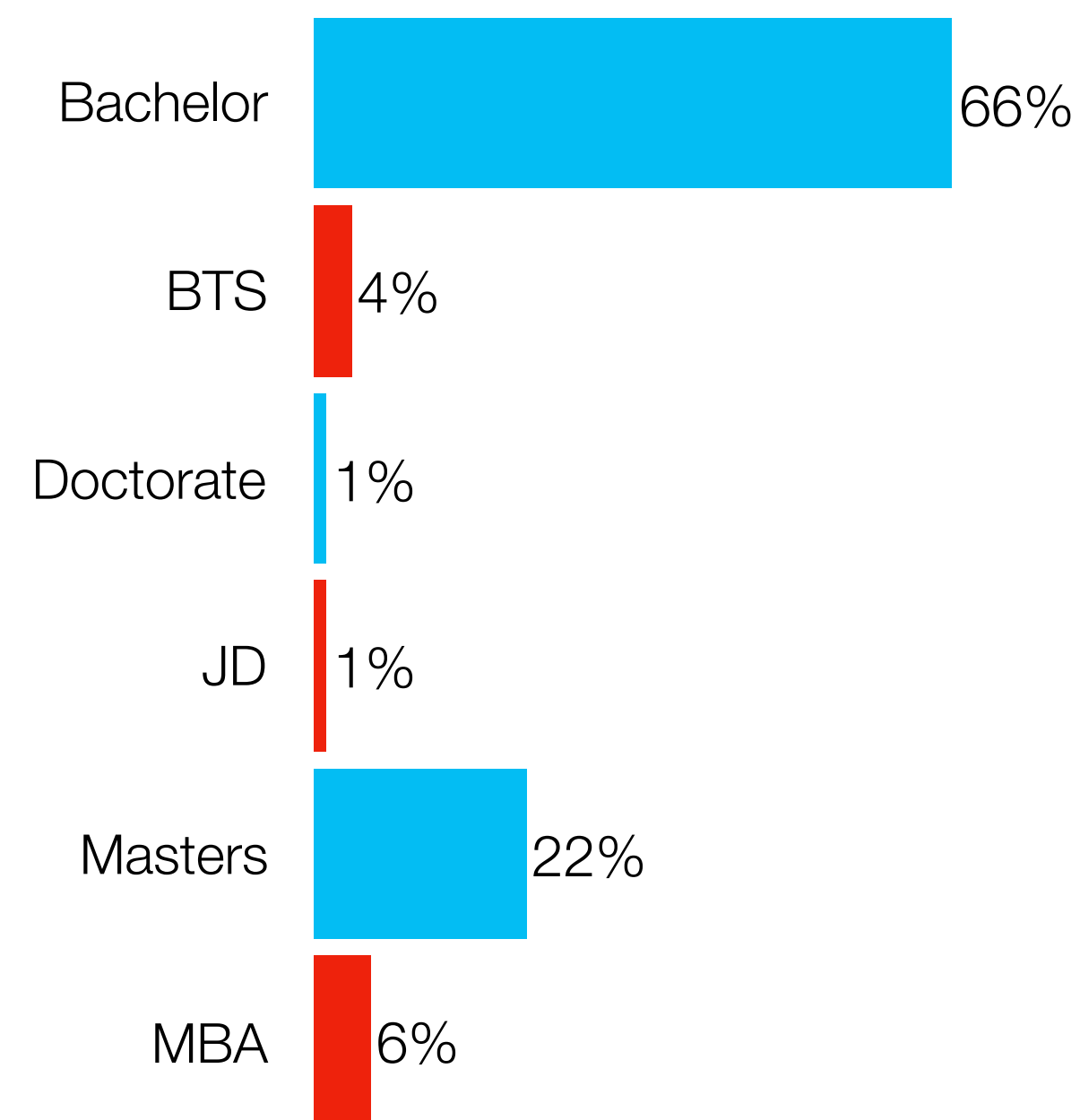
Live in Same State as Ancestor's Death



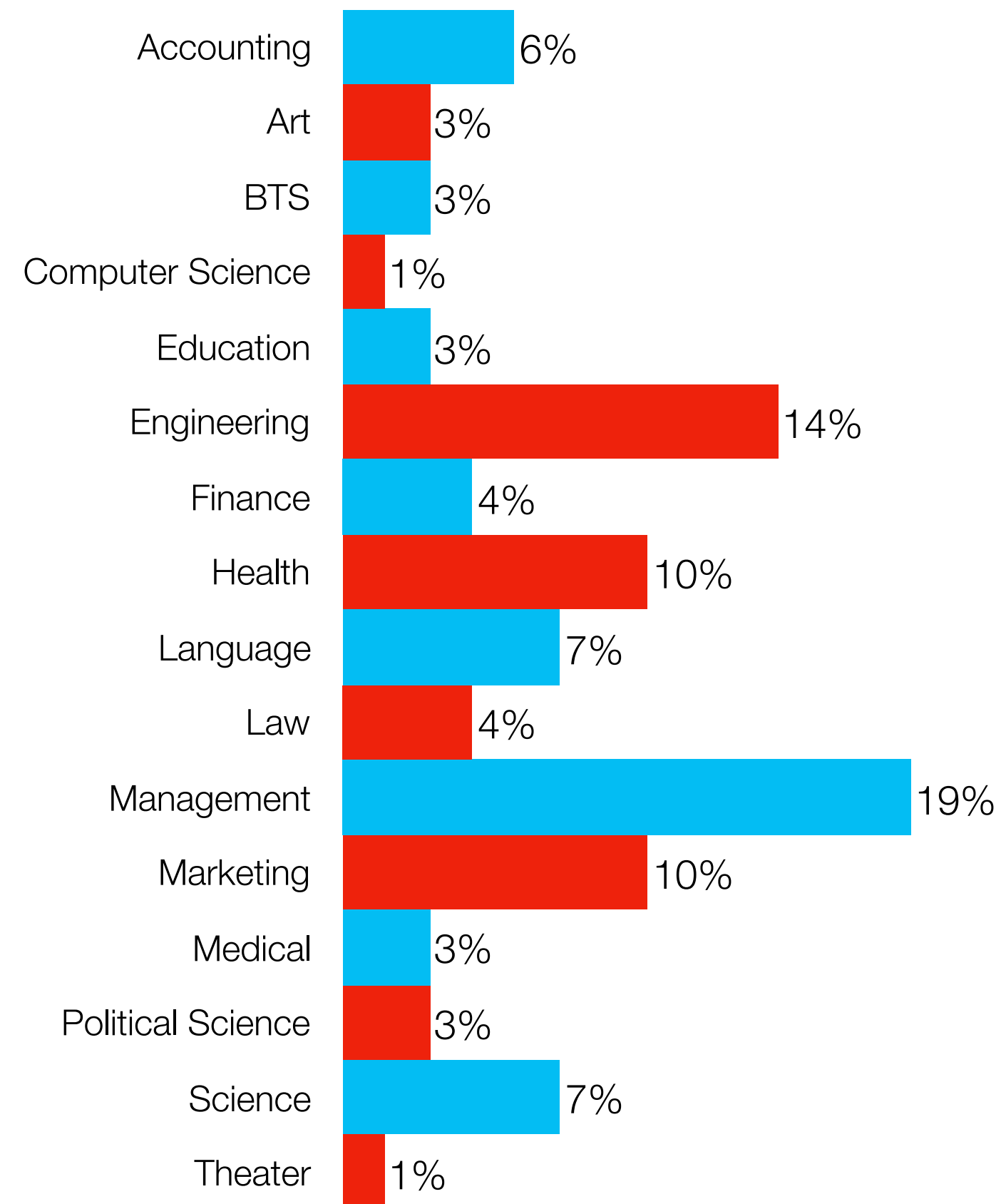

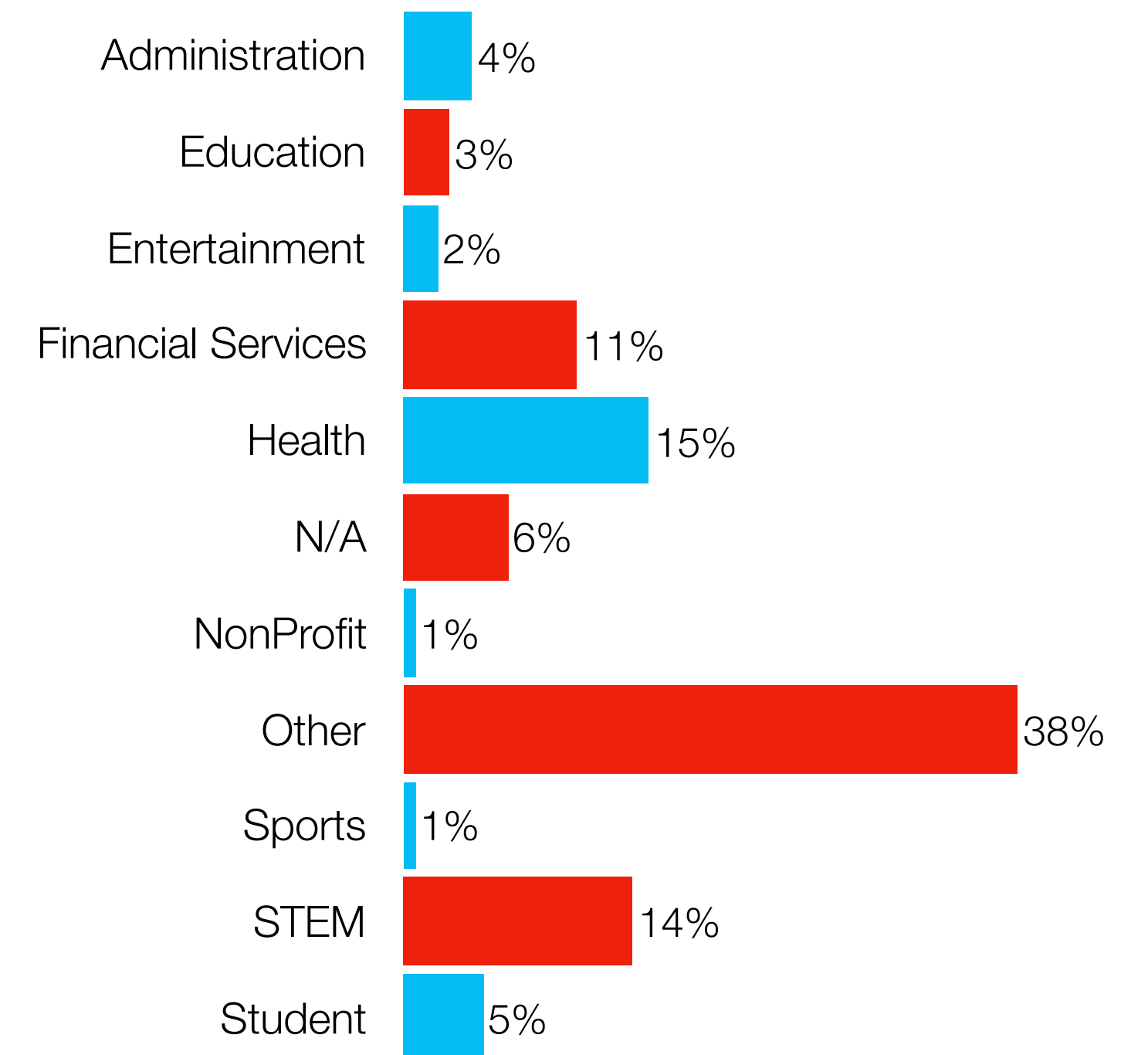
Education Level



Field of Study

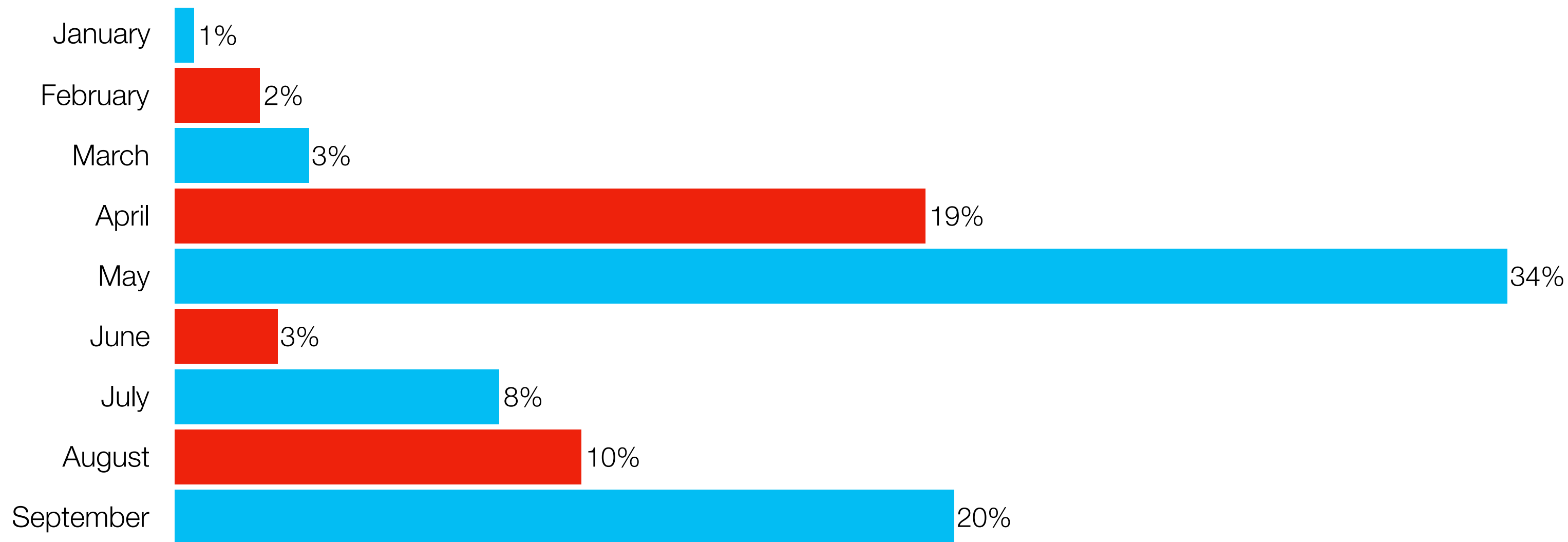
